Introduction:

To those wondering what Wimpglish is and how it works or what are its origins it's quite simple, Wimpglish, is a mix between American Southern/Londoner Lingo, Latin, German and French made into one language. I am the creator of this language and made it out of sheer boredom. Its alphabet is a mix of those previously mentioned languages and it also uses dead letters. This short guide will give the basic rules, its alphabet, and some basic words.

Entry I: It's Alphabet

Entry II: It's Rules

The rules are the same as English but also take small influences from Latin and French rules of the alphabet, specifically from

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Latin they only take the fact that inflections often change in the ending of a word, but can be more complicated, especially with verbs. Thus verbs can take any of over 100 different endings to express different meanings. And from the French they take the fact that Nouns are naming words. In French, all nouns are either masculine or feminine (e.g. le journal, la idée) and can be singular or plural. The rest works like basic English and the pronunciation is a mix of German, Latin and French with southern drawl.

Entry III: Some basic words

Numbers: Üni - One, Dëux - Two, Tröiß - Three, & Qærtüß - Four. Words: Ziët - Night, Livræ - Book, Dër - The, & Öftæn - Often Example: Së dëhänchër! Seine Tröiß-quīnqüāgintæ! - Hurry up! It's 3:50!
